Fire Chief's Report:

Old Business:

- For the AFG we received a denial letter. Getting with the grant writer on what was right and what was wrong to submit a new on Oct 28th.
- Contacts for commercial buildings-is still a work in progress
- E 4 replacement-Now there is a new clerk there will be budget workshops for equipment replacement and funding
- The sale of E1 and R 3 still no further interest from a buyer
- Rover is out as of Oct 31st. I Am Responding went live on Nov 1st.
- We received an email today from Sen Skoufis about the signature block for the SUV grant. It's one step further to being done.
- TC Energy grant is still being worked on.
- Still waiting for buyers for the Boat and Hurst Tools. There was someone interested from Hemlock Farms for the boat but haven't heard anything back.
- Fire Prevention presentations at the schools and day cares are almost done. There are just a couple more that need to be done.

New Business:

- Lexipol for SOP in place
- PERMA Grant was applied for the Extractor Dryer. May be about \$5,000. The unit will cost more.
- The fire department will be handing out glow sticks during Halloween night.
- There is a growing safety issue with the bikes, scooters, and ebikes at night. They are hard to see, can travel up to 30mph and when responding to a call in a city or personal vehicle they can be a hazard.
- Still working on a review panel for the RFQ.

Emergency Management/ Vehicle Maintenance Report:

Old Business:

- Truck 7 went to Wariwck to hopefully get the DEF issue fixed
- Engine 5 – We are in contact with Hendricks about the issues with the new motor
- The Hazard Mitigation Plan is now done.
- 911 Boxes-They are requesting information from the council if we want to replace the call boxes and if it affects our ISO rating and insurance.
- The firehouses do not have long distance telephone service. This maybe an issue for elections.
- The Dam inspection report for December 2023 states that #2 dam is worst than #1 and #3. A lack in maintenance is creating cracks and seepage.
- Water is still being pumped into the River. With the dry weather we have been having it may create an issue it the winter to keep the river flowing and reduce ice build up.

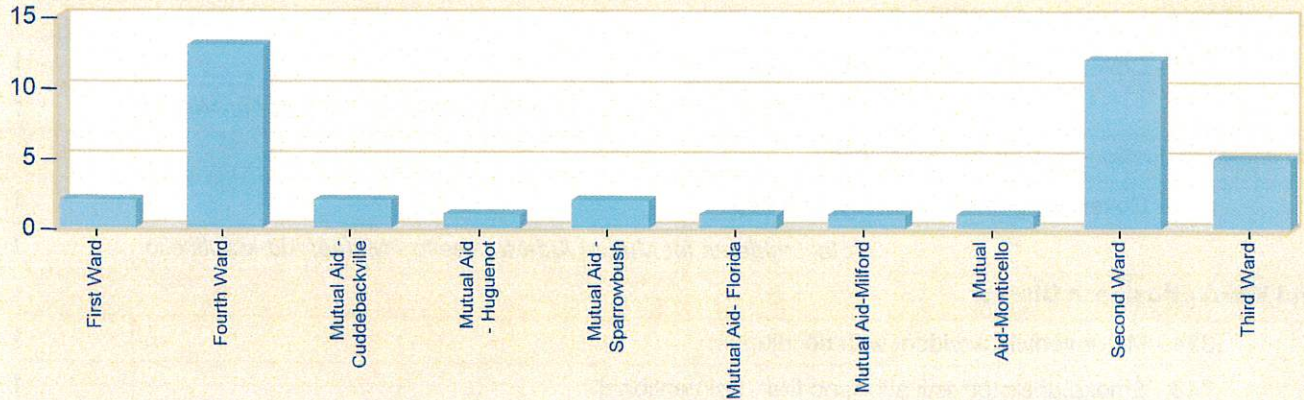
