Meeting Minutes

Call to order- The meeting was called to order by Mr. Vicchiariello at 6:00pm with the following members in attendance: Ms. Fuller, Ms. Mann, Mr. Vicchiariello, Lt. Fitzpatrick, Chief Worden.

Pledge of Allegiance

Public Comment- No public comment received.

New Business

- An update was provided to the committee pertaining to National Night Out against crime celebration scheduled for August 28th.
- School Crossing Guard Posts 2024-2025 School Year: The committee approved the following school crossing guard safety plan to be deployed for the 2024-5 new school year for the newly constructed East Main St. Elementary School and Port Jervis Middle School:
 - 7am-8am, 2pm -3pm Middle School Posts Grades 6-8: Post #1: Intersection of Kingston Avenue and Culvert Street, Post #2 Intersection of Kingston Avenue and East Main Street.
 - 8am-9am, 3pm-4pm: Elementary School Posts – Grades k-5: Post #1: East Main Street /Pennsylvania Avenue, Post #2: Intersection of Kingston Avenue and East Main Street.
- Grant Reimbursements- The Department is compiling documentation for grant reimbursements related to the 2017 DASNY Grant (Range Building), Child Passenger Safety Grant, Police Traffic Services and 2024-5 DCJS Byrne JAG Grant (patrol car and equipment)
- Chapter 115-15 of the city code which is the 15-mile rule- The committee discussed the need to increase the current 15-mile residency requirement for City employment to

increase recruitment and the number of candidates eligible for City employment opportunities.

- Server Replacement- The committee discussed the need to upgrade or replace a main computer server at the Police Department. According to the City's IT contractor, Spinner Tech, the cost for replacing the aging server is \$9,850.65 in comparison to \$4,784.00 to upgrade. The committee forwarded the matter to Finance for review.
- The committee discussed the need to request MTA Police assistance for staffing a gate crossing at the Fowler Street Railroad gate to help facilitate the upcoming National Night Out Against Crime Celebration, Fall Festival, Harvest Festival and Trunk or Treat at Riverside Park.

Old Business

- Technology Grant – Public Cameras- The committee reviewed a proposal provided by Gridless Power, a dealer of Verkada public street cameras, to upgrade the City's current public street surveillance network. The proposed upgrade would replace twelve (12) existing street cameras in addition to installing cameras at eight (8) newly proposed camera sites including a fixed license plate reader site.

The committee will continue to review proposals for future recommendation for purchase to the Common Council. The Police Department was awarded \$208,500.00 to finance this project through a 2024 DCJS Technology Grant.

- License Plate Reader Project – Project Safe Neighborhoods Grant- License plate reader installations at the intersections of East Main Street and N. Maple Avenue, Kingston Avenue/Van Avenue, and Pike St/Water Street are complete. Reimbursement for the project has been submitted to the Finn Institute pursuant to the DOJ Safe Neighborhoods Grant.
