DPW meeting minutes for 4/1/24

Meeting called to order at 6:00pm by Chairman Hockenberry.

Meeting held in the Mayor's conference room due to early and primary voting in the council chambers.

Present were Director Duryea, Asst Director Addy, councilmembers Oney and O'connell

There was no public comment.

There were no public hearings.

There was no executive session.

New business

We discussed the SMART grant for orange square/ veteran's park. The work on the fountain will begin before the end of the month and the construction of the new stage by the DPW will begin sometime in May. All work to be completed before the Italian festival in August.

We discussed the SMART grand for west end beach the Director will see how much money is left and begin repairing the bathrooms with that remaining money.

We discussed and agreed to seek bids for a back yard clean up at 140 ball st. The items at that location were not safe to be handled by our employees.

We discussed a letter received by the mayor regarding storm water run off issues at property located at 76 Hamilton st. It was decided to consult with one of our engineering firms about how to remedy the issue.

We discussed the auction inventory and getting the list to the city clerk to prepare a list for the city council to declare surplus so we could proceed with the auction.

The following projects will be upcoming.

Washing / cleaning the pike at underpass. The removal of the dam at Chris Marion Park. Work will begin in orange square park. Tree cutting on Orchard at.

We discussed the proposed Dial A Bus loop which will be starting in the middle of April.

We decided to post the open mechanics position for a period of 2 weeks. This will be posted as promotional within the department.

We Discussed the sewer relining project. I had questions as to why could not be doing this with the sewer money that we had collected for the past 7-8 years and not put the city in debt for 20 million dollars. There were discussions about purchasing needed equipment and the cost of hiring additional employees to do the job. It was

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decided that I would look into how much money we had available in the sewer account to see what options we have available to us.

We discussed the lateral line (lead Pipe) project and can use the rest of that money to replace as many lines as we can.

The meeting was closed at approximately 7:00pm.
