2024 NEW YORK STATE EMPIRE STATE DEVELOPMENT RESTORE NY ROUND 8 APPLICATION

WHEREAS, the City of Port Jervis continuously seeks grant funding to support projects deemed important to its citizens and economic development within the City; and

WHEREAS, now open and due by Wednesday, May 22, 2024, by 3:00 p.m., is the New York State Empire State Development (ESD) Round 8, RESTORE NY Communities Initiative grant application with an opportunity for the City to apply for up to \$2M to demolish/deconstruct and/or rehabilitate/reconstruct up to two projects; and

WHEREAS, the City has preliminarily approved the potential project to demolish and reconstruct 29 Front St., Port Jervis, New York, resulting in a seven-story mixed use building with commercial units on the first floor, 32 apartments and storage space, and a Letter of Intent for said project has been accepted by ESD; and

WHEREAS, the putative owner of the lands upon which the project will be constructed, MC LAND1 DEVELOPMENT, LLC, has supplied the necessary documents to the Common Council in conjunction with the grant application and has agreed to fully cooperate with the City with respect to the submission and completion of said application, inclusive of providing any additional documentation or information during the application process; and

WHEREAS, MC LAND1 DEVELOPMENT, LLC has deposited and committed \$2 million to this project, which is presently estimated to cost a total of \$6,000,000; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the parameters of the grant program, the City will serve as a pass-through; of the grant funds on behalf of the private developer and all grant costs will be paid for by MC LAND 1 DEVELOPMENT, LLC with the understanding that the grant, if awarded, will be reimbursed; and

WHEREAS, the City is in receipt of a \$1000 deposit from MC LAND1 DEVELOPMENT, LLC to cover initial City administrative expenses and grant application fees; and

WHEREAS, MC LAND1 DEVELOPMENT, LLC has agreed to complete any and all final agreements between the company and the City including but not limited to project time frames, benchmarks, responsibilities, and costs prior to the City's acceptance of any grant funds awarded hereunder,

NOW THEREFORE, it is hereby

RESOLVED, that with all conditions satisfied, the Common Council of the City of Port Jervis, hereby approves the submission of a RESTORE Round 8 Grant for the above-described project by 3:00 PM on Wednesday, May 22, 2024, and that the Mayor, or his designee, Valerie Maginsky, Executive Director of the Port Jervis Community Development Agency, is authorized to execute any and all documents in connection with the foregoing.

**RESOLUTION OF THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PORT JERVIS
DECLARING LEAD AGENCY STATUS FOR THE TOWN OF DEERPARK LAND
ACQUISITION PROJECT**

WHEREAS, the Common Council of the City of Port Jervis wishes to acquire certain real property from the Town of Deerpark through the Orange County Land Trust, Inc. which parcels of property are identified as Town of Deerpark SBLs 24-2-29.1, 24-2-29.21, 24-2-12.1, 34-2-1; and

WHEREAS, the subject parcels are part of the City's surface water supply watershed. The property will be transferred from the Town of Deerpark to the Orange County Land Trust, Inc., from which the City will purchase the property. Ownership of the land by the City will help to ensure that the City will be able to control use of the watershed property in a manner that will protect the City's drinking water supply which includes water surface storage in three reservoirs; and

WHEREAS, the Common Council has been previously approved for a matching grant under the NYS Water Quality Improvement Project (WQIP) Program in the amount of \$158,066.04 in connection with the intended property acquisition project, and to proceed with the project, it is necessary for the Common Council to undertake an environmental review of the project; and

WHEREAS, the Common Council hereby initially determines that the aforementioned proposed project is a Type I action subject to the SEQRA regulations and determines that it will be the Lead Agency with respect to the consideration, review, and determination of significance of the proposed project pursuant to SEQRA regulations,

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS:

1. The Common Council of the City of Port Jervis hereby authorizes the appropriate City officials to execute any and all documents necessary to continue with the grant process pursuant to the NYS Water Quality Improvement Project (WQIP) Program in connection with the land acquisition project and designates City DPW Director Superintendent Steven R. Duryea to be the principal point of contact for the project.
2. In accordance with the provisions of § 617.6 of the regulations implementing the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act (“SEQRA”), (the “SEQRA regulations”), the Common Council hereby determines that the aforementioned proposed project is an action subject to SEQRA regulations.
3. The Common Council preliminarily classifies the aforementioned action as Type I pursuant to 6 NYCRR Section 617.4(b)(4) of the SEQRA regulations.
4. The Common Council determines that it is, and will be, the Lead Agency with respect to the consideration, review, and determination of significance of the proposed action pursuant to SEQRA regulations and any other regulations including the National Environmental Policy Act (“NEPA”).
5. The appropriate City official shall notify all interested and involved agencies of the City’s intent to act as Lead Agency hereunder.
