Handicap Parking Request – 138 Pike Street (Library)

- Committee reviewed request from former Library Director Curran Koehler (Feb. 12, 2026).
- Request denied due to inability to meet ADA accessibility and safety requirements.

Key issues:

- High-traffic roadway posing a safety hazard.
- Roadway grade unsuitable for mobility devices.
- Inability to create a compliant access aisle.
- Misaligned curb ramp requiring wheelchair users to enter traffic lane.
- Library currently has ADA-compliant parking in rear and side lots.

Range Building Project

- Finalizing computer installation and furniture purchases.
- Ribbon-cutting scheduled for May.

Committee Comments

- Mr. Siegel raised concerns about the reckless operation of e-bikes and scooters.
