Fire Chief's Report:

Old Business:

- -AFG no updates and nothing official
- -RFQ is in progress
- -TC Cameras have not been installed
- C-1 we are still waiting for delivery
- Lexipol is doing well
- Information was sent to Stacy about the Apparatus replacement
- Emergency Networking slow and steady but there is major issues with the IAR pushes throughout the county
- Fireworks Standby went well. Working with the Fire Investigator for next years event to see if there needs to be a change in the policies and the layout.

New Business:

- New SCBA compressor was delivered. It will be installed in a couple of weeks. The epoxy on the floor is still being done.
- We are working on painting the Decon Room. Doing the epoxy on that floor also. Checking with Wayne at the city about installing a pump.

- June we had 37 calls, that brings our 2025 YTD total to 241. That is a 27% increase from last years total YTD of 190 calls
- The parade went well. The weather was good and the new route is working well.
- Parking at West End Beach during an emergency is becoming a problem. Working with the PD regarding this.
- There was a discussion regarding updating the Training Centers Training equipment (i.e Projectors, computers) because the facility is used city wide for other training needs.

Emergency Management Report:

- T-7 came back but Ryan found the problem and was able to fix it now it has been running with no check engine lights. There were other issues, but they can be fixed.
- E-5There is an issue with the air compressor. The issue is that there is engine oil getting into the system. It may have to go to Hendrickson to be fixed because it's new.
- The city may buy the equipment to do the inspections on the fire trucks. They were all done this year, so they are good for now.

New Business:

- River is doing fine. It's been running at 3.3 feet Reservoirs are at 94 % and 97 %
- There was an incident where the Y Camp sent some girls down the river when it was high. And they needed to be rescued. The camp didn't know the river was high. This issue brought up the fact that they should have a River Hot Line that people can call to check the status of the river.


