### Greetings and Good Evening -

I'm here tonight to present a brief update on the Downtown Revitalization Initiative, and in particular, the proposal for an at-grade railroad crossing at Fowler and Fourth St. between the downtown and Riverside Park for which a public hearing has been scheduled for February 14th here in Port Jervis.

In late October the DRI Local Planning Committee completed its review of the projects submitted and approved 13 projects totaling almost \$12 million for inclusion in the DRI Strategic Investment Plan. Written by the DRI planning firm Nelson, Pope Voorhees, the Strategic Investment Plan has been submitted to New York State for review and consideration.

Copies of the Strategic Investment Plan will not be available until the State has announced its selections which are anticipated for Spring 2024.

Currently, these projects include:

**Four Public Improvement Projects** 

Two New Development Projects

Five Redevelopment/Restoration Projects

One Small Project Fund

One Branding and Marketing Project - led by the City.

Of the \$10 million grant, and minus payment of \$300,000 to the consultant, \$9.7 million dollars remain to be allocated. Therefore, since almost \$12 million in projects were submitted, not every project listed will receive funding.

Should the small project fund be awarded, there will be a new round of applications opened to each project that previously submitted as well as any new projects.

Again, we will not know until the state announces the approved project list in this hopefully in the spring.

Now, to concentrate on the at-grade railroad crossing between the downtown and Riverside Park.

As many of you are aware the city has sought a legal public crossing at this location for many years.

Through the DRI project review both an at-grade and an overhead pedestrian bridge were discussed. For multiple reasons including cost, maintenance, and maintaining a clear view, an at-grade crossing was by far the preferred solution.

Currently blocked by simple metal farm gates which are easily gone around, this crossing is actually a private crossing with emergency access to Port Jervis first responders. For special events, railroad personnel would open and oversee pedestrian crossings. Otherwise, walking across the tracks is a safety hazard and is actually considered to be trespassing.

Having the designation of the crossing changed from private to public would allow the city to install a mutually agreed upon designed crossing.

Design options range from basic striping and signs with fencing to channel people to the crossing to adding bells, arms and lights, and up to the inclusion of magnetic gates. The DRI estimate for this project is up to \$635,000.

The petition requesting this change via a hearing was approved by the previous council and submitted to NYS DOT by the project engineer in early December.

Since then, twenty-four letters carrying 30 signatures ranging from Orange County government officials including County Executive Steven Neuhaus and our local Orange County Legislator Thomas Faggione, new Common Council members, Port Jervis CDA Board members, various Port Jervis department heads and business owners and local residents were sent in support of holding the hearing and the consideration of a public crossing.

This information was received and accepted and now a hearing has been scheduled.

The New York State Department of Transportation will hold the public hearing, currently referred to as case number 7029, on February 14th from 11 AM to 4 PM here in the Council Chambers.

With all participants in person, the Honorable Dustin B. Howard, Administrative Law Judge, New York State Department of Transportation will preside over the hearing.

Testimony will be provided by the City representatives Mayor Cicalese, Assistant DPW Director Addy, and Peter Melewski, project engineer. Metro North railroad personnel and NYS DOT staff will also testify and Norfolk Southern has the option of attending and has thus far deferred to Metro North.

Though a virtual Zoom session will be available for viewing, in the words of NYS DOT, the public is also invited to speak at the hearing for up to three minutes each.






